III. Public Hearing on the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR)

Mr. Elias Trevino, Director of Assessment/Accountability and Bilingual/ESL, provided the following information on the TAPR report.

>The Comprehensive TAPR report provides details of district and campus academic performance along with financial reports and information about staff, programs, and demographics. As required by Texas Education Code 39.036, all district's board of trustees must hold a Public Hearing within 90 calendar days of receiving the report. On March 16, 2020, Governor Abbot cancelled all STAR and end of course exams. Some sections of the TAPR report were not able to be updated and thus contain 2018-2019 data. All other sections are up to date as reflected on the report.

>The Department of Assessment and Accountability closely monitors the data provided through the TAPR and shared with all the departments to ensure the data is being interpreted correctly. The final goal is to increase student achievement.

























Mrs. Melva Segura, Human Resources Administrator, presented information on the percentage of staff members in comparison to the Region and the State.

- •Professional Staff: Includes teachers, professional support, campus administration and central office administration 60.2% (Below the State and above the Region)
- •Teachers: 47.2% (Below the State and above the Region)
- •Professional Support: Includes Therapists, Nurses, Librarians, Counselors, and any other professional staff. CIF's (Campus Instructional Facilitators) are also included under this category.
- >WISD is at 10.8% (Above the State and the Region)
- •Campus Administration: 1.2% (Below the State and the Region)
- Majority of assistants at the campuses are classified as Instructional Facilitators vs. Assistant Principals. The Middle Schools and the two comprehensive high schools have Assistant Principals.
- •Central Administration: 1.0% (Below the State and the Region)
- •Educational Aides: 8.3% (Below the State and the Region)

The district closely monitors this category and is increasing the numbers specifically in the area of Pre-K and special education aides as needed.

•Auxiliary Staff: 31.6% (Above the State and below the Region)

Mrs. Segura commented that based on the information presented, WISD is behind in some major areas; nonetheless, the information clearly shows that WISD continues to remain competitive with regard to compensation, recruitment, and retention.

Mr. Andres Sanchez, Assistant Superintendent of Business & Finance, presented information based on the latest audited fiscal year 2018-2019:

- >WISD has the lowest tax rate at \$1.1597. It is below the State and the Region.
- >The M&O tax rate is at \$1.1397, higher than the State and the Region.
- >The I&S tax rate is at \$0.0200 which is a lot lower than the State and the Region. This means that the tax rate assessed to pay for bond debt was lower for WISD.
