ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR REMOTE LEARNING

APPLIED TO ALL STUDENTS

- 1. Attendance is important even while learning online.
- 2. Students are expected to be in attendance daily.
- 3. Teachers will record daily student attendance.
- 4. Student attendance will be recorded for each class according to the student's schedule.
- 5. Students are required to attend at least 90% of their classes and to pass their classes to receive course credit and be promoted to the next grade level.
- 6. Excessive absences will be referred for truancy.

• Secondary attendance taken each class period

ASYNCHRONOUS

(SELF-PACED ONLINE LEARNING)

 Attendance will be based on work performed and turned in on time





TYPES OF Remote Learning

THERE WILL BE TWO TYPES OF AT HOME LEARNING PROVIDED BY WISD

SYNCHRONOUS

This requires students and teachers to be online at the same time.

For example: Students & teachers participate in live, teacher-supported work on video conference calls. Tests are scheduled and timed online.

More information: Online live learning will follow a schedule with students attending class via computers from home. Daily attendance will be checked and students who are not logged in will be marked absent. If needed, technology equipment will be made available to students.

ASYNCHRONOUS

This does not require students and teachers to log on at the same time.

For example: Online courses are self-paced with intermittent teacher instruction and preassigned work. Student will watch prerecorded videos with guided support.

More information: While learning is self-paced, some online meetings or lectures may be required. Daily attendance will not be checked; however daily engagement is required. If needed, technology equipment will be made available to students.

In an effort to reach all students and offer student/parent choice as it relates to instruction, the above schedule reflects both synchronous, asynchronous and asynchronous with a synchronous component-options that are delineated in the district plan. As a campus, we do not want to lose that direct instruction that is needed to maintain a high level of student engagement while maintaining a rigorous curriculum meant to prepare students to meet the challenges of the next class.


Students are expected to login to Google classroom daily in an effort to allow teachers the opportunity to provide instructional support.

Students are required to do the following to show proof of attendance through one of these three methods:

- Show daily progress in the Learning Management System (LMS) such as Google Classroom, etc.; or
- Show daily progress via teacher-student interactions, as defined in the approved learning plan; or
- Completion/Turn-in of assignments from student to teacher (potentially via email, on-line, or mail).

Teachers will follow up with students who are participating at home through an asynchronous method to ensure they are completing assignments and showing daily progress.

During an asynchronous day, the teacher may schedule synchronous lessons with class however, teacher must communicate schedule to class to ensure timely login.



HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SYNCHRONOUS SCHEDULE

- Students must meet the 240 minimum daily required minutes by the state;
- Students will be engaged with teachers in real time as the lesson progresses;
- 10 min Opener 30 min Direct Instruction/Lecture 25 min Student work time/teacher support 10 min Exit Ticket/Review (Lessons MUST be recorded and made available throughout the week)
- Lectures will take place in real time and recorded for future reference;
- All teachers will be taking attendance if students appear in the virtual class;
- Students must meet the 90% attendance rule;
- ADA period will continue to be 2nd period however, students must still be present all other periods;

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

STUDENTS WILL BE EXPECTED TO DO THE FOLLOWING ON A DAILY BASIS:

- 1. Contact campus if experiencing technology issues;
- 2. Request Chromebook and/or Hot Spot to ensure connectivity with district selected LMS;
- 3. Students will login daily either synchronously or asynchronously;
 - Expectations for synchronous learning:
 - For synchronous learning activities, students' regular schedule will be followed for the class to come together and conduct instruction/lecture and work in pairs, small groups, and/or all together.
 - During asynchronous learning, students will be able to progress at their own pace through the content. Teachers will contact students as needed to ensure progress is being documented and to be used as a resource for learning.
- 4. At the end of each class period, students will be provided time to complete an exit ticket identifying instructional areas that were understood and instructional areas that student needs assistance.
- 5. During asynchronous learning and after 4:00 pm, contact may be made with the teacher however, response may happen the following day.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

The Special Education Department will continue in carrying out Child Find responsibilities.

All identified students will be participating in the District's Virtual Plan for Instruction with services and supports being provided by Special Education teachers/service providers.

All students with disabilities will have available to them the same access to materials, and opportunities as all other students. A Free Appropriate Public Education will be provided to the greatest extent possible.

Enhanced SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR WISD

CLEANING & DISINFECTING

Cleaning and disinfecting of WISD schools and buildings will take place on a daily basis. Special care will be placed to all high touch areas such as door knobs, push bars and light switches. Hand sanitizing and/or hand washing stations will be available at every entrance, in the hallways and in all classrooms. Custodial staff will be using an EPA approved disinfectant (NOTE: This list is currently available on the TxSSC COVID-19 resource page and the EPA website.)

FACE COVERINGS

Weslaco ISD requires everyone who is on campus or in a WISD building to wear a face covering or mask. In addition to wearing a mask or face covering we recommend individuals remain 6 feet away from one another.

STUDENT ISOLATION PLAN (FALL 2020)

Parents will have a choice of online learning from home all year. We anticipate in person (on campus) learning will likely be available at a later date. If a student who is taking classes on campus develops COVID-19 symptoms the following student isolation plan will take place.

- Symptomatic students will be required to apply a face covering and report to the designated ISD isolation area for further evaluation.
- The ill student will remain isolated with a designated staff member to be monitored and receive medical care if needed until parent/ guardian arrives for student pick up.
- Monitoring staff member must perform hand hygiene and wear PPE for the duration of the isolation period.
- Campus administrators will immediately notify District Health Services and will follow their guidance.
- After students and staff are removed from the isolation area, it will be sanitized using approved germicidal agents by WISD custodial staff wearing appropriate PPE.
